1. UN COMMITTEE ON THE ELIMINATION OF RACIAL DISCRIMINATION UNCERD**WHY IN NEWS**

- The **UN Committee** on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (UNCERD) issued findings regarding India's implementation of international obligations.
- The Indian government rejected sweeping generalizations in the committee's observations regarding human rights compliance.

WHAT IS UNCERD?

- UNCERD is a body of independent experts that monitors the implementation of the International Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination (ICERD).
- State parties are obliged to submit periodic reports to the committee on how civil, political, economic, social, and cultural rights are being protected.

KEY OBSERVATIONS AND INDIA'S RESPONSE

- The committee raised concerns over domestic hate speech, treatment of minority communities, and legal rights surrounding citizenship.
- India officially contested the committee's observations, citing unverified claims and generalizations that overlook constitutional and legal safeguards.

2. PARIVARTAN SCHEME DELHI NCR COMMERCIAL VEHICLES**WHY IN NEWS**

- The government targets 25,000 commercial vehicle registrations under the Parivartan scheme to phase out polluting trucks and buses in Delhi-NCR.
- Fifteen major vehicle manufacturers have signed agreements to offer financial discounts for commercial vehicle upgrades.

WHAT IS THE PARIVARTAN SCHEME?

- A targeted initiative aimed at replacing old, polluting commercial diesel and petrol vehicles operating in the National Capital Region (NCR).
- It blends government policy incentives with manufacturer-led financial discounts to accelerate vehicle fleet modernizations.

KEY FEATURES AND OPERATIONAL STRATEGY

- Commercial vehicle owners receive financial incentives and manufacturer discounts when scrapping old vehicles and purchasing compliant alternatives.
- Focuses heavily on heavy commercial fleets, including buses and multi-axle freight trucks, which contribute significantly to winter air pollution.

WHY IT MATTERS

- Addresses severe vehicular pollution and particulate matter emission issues across NCR.
- Aligns with broader national scrappage policies and electric/clean fuel transition frameworks.

KEY TERMS

- **Vehicle Scrappage Policy:** A framework to phase out unfit and polluting vehicles to promote fuel efficiency and safety.

3. INDIA SCO SUMMIT CENTRAL ASIA UNSC 2028-29

- Efforts are underway to reinvigorate institutional formats such as the long-pending India-Central Asia Summit.

WHAT IS THE CONTEXT?

- India actively utilizes regional forums like the SCO to engage Central Asian republics, Iran, and key regional powers.
- Diplomatic focus centers on energy security, regional connectivity projects such as **INSTC**, and multilateral governance reform.

KEY DIPLOMATIC OBJECTIVES

- Strengthening bilateral and regional links with Central Asian states, missing formal summit-level meetings since 2022.
- Laying diplomatic groundwork for India's candidature for a non-permanent seat on the UN Security Council for the 2028-2029 term.

WHY IT MATTERS

- Highlights India's strategic balance between Eurasian integration forums (SCO, BRICS) and global governance platforms (UNSC).
- Vital for continental security, counter-terrorism alignment, and trade connectivity routes into Eurasia.

KEY TERMS

- **UNSC Non-Permanent Seat:** Ten seats on the UN Security Council elected by the General Assembly for two-year terms.
- **INSTC:** International North-South Transport Corridor connecting India to Central Asia and Russia via Iran.

4. GST COUNCIL STRUCTURE AND GOVERNANCE**WHY IN NEWS**

- The Goods and Services Tax (GST) Council scheduled its upcoming meeting to discuss compliance simplification for taxpayers.

WHAT IS THE GST COUNCIL?

- Constitutional body established under **Article 279A** following the 101st **Constitutional Amendment Act, 2016**.
- Chaired by the Union Finance Minister, with members comprising the Union Minister of State for Finance and Finance/Tax Ministers from all 28 States and 3 Union Territories with legislatures (Delhi, Puducherry, Jammu & Kashmir).

DECISION-MAKING MECHANISM

- Every decision requires a three-fourths majority of weighted votes present and voting.
- The Central Government holds a weightage of one-third of total votes cast, while all State Governments combined hold a weightage of two-thirds.

WHY IT MATTERS

- Serves as the primary institutional vehicle for cooperative federalism in indirect taxation.
- Recommendations of the GST Council are advisory and non-binding on Parliaments and State Assemblies as held in the Mohit Minerals judgment.

KEY TERMS

- **Article 279A:** Constitutional provision empowering the President to constitute the GST Council.

- **Cooperative Federalism:** A model of governance where Union and State executive authorities collaboratively formulate fiscal policy.
