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WHY IN NEWS

- Union Health Ministry reviewed the implementation of Union Budget 2026-27 commitments to increase emergency and trauma care capacity in District Hospitals by 50%.

WHAT IS THE INITIATIVE?

- A national health infrastructure initiative to strengthen Emergency and Trauma Care Centres across District Hospitals.
- Utilises gap analysis based on Indian Public Health Standards (IPHS) to evaluate baseline facility readiness, human resources, and digital integration.

PHASES AND IMPLEMENTATION DETAILS

- Covers 613 District Hospitals in three distinct phases based on patient load and structural readiness.
- Phase I targets 160 District Hospitals for completion by March 2027, Phase II covers 203 hospitals, and Phase III will upgrade the remaining 250.
- Integrates National Emergency Life Support (NELS) training to enhance clinical competencies of healthcare personnel.

WHY IT MATTERS

- Addresses secondary healthcare bottlenecks by reducing referral burdens on tertiary institutions like AIIMS.
- Standardises public emergency care networks through unified digital pre-hospital integration and IPHS benchmarks.

KEY TERMS

- **Indian Public Health Standards:** Set of uniform benchmarks prescribed for public health facilities to ensure quality healthcare delivery across India.
- **National Emergency Life Support:** A standardised training program aimed at building emergency care capacities of doctors and paramedical staff.
