Pokhran 1974

Indian underground test described officially as a peaceful nuclear explosion.

Pokhran-II 1998

Series of tests after which India declared itself a nuclear-weapon State in fact, still outside NPT membership as such.

No first use

Declared doctrine that nuclear weapons would not be used first; a political restraint, not a physical law.

NSG waiver 2008

Nuclear Suppliers Group exception that allowed civil nuclear trade with India.

NPT 1968

Treaty that recognises only 1945-era weapon States plus later acknowledged P5; India refused to join as a non-weapon State.
